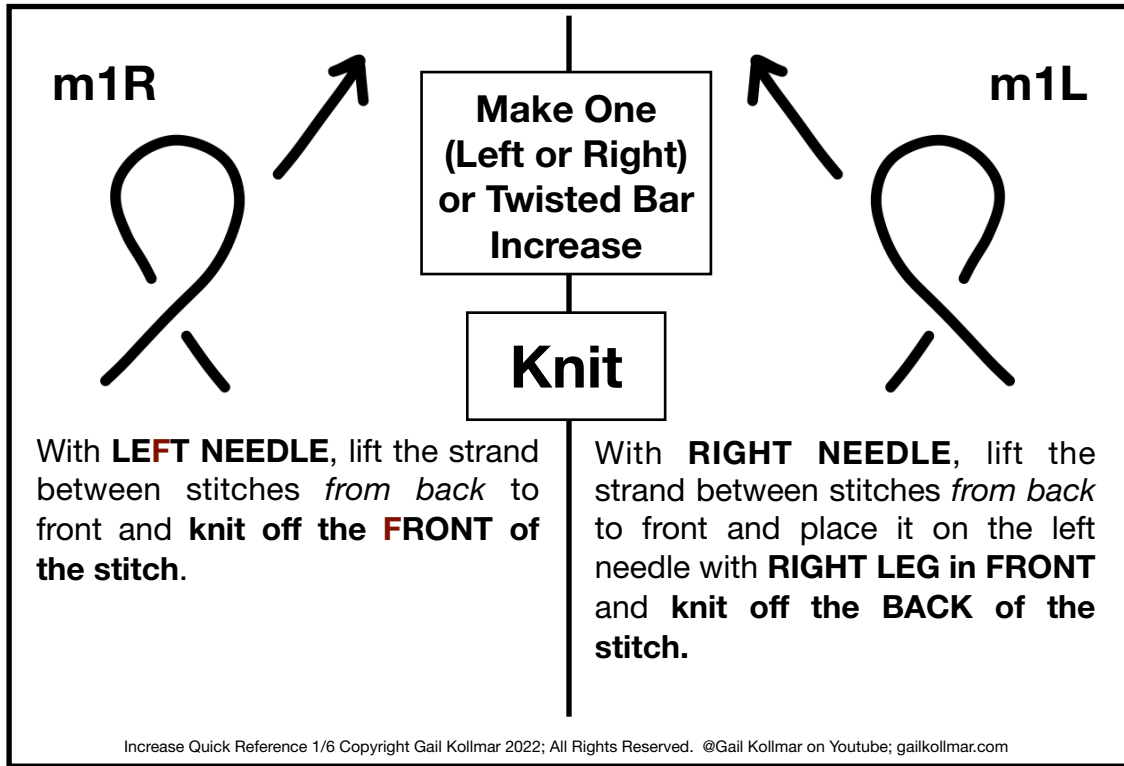
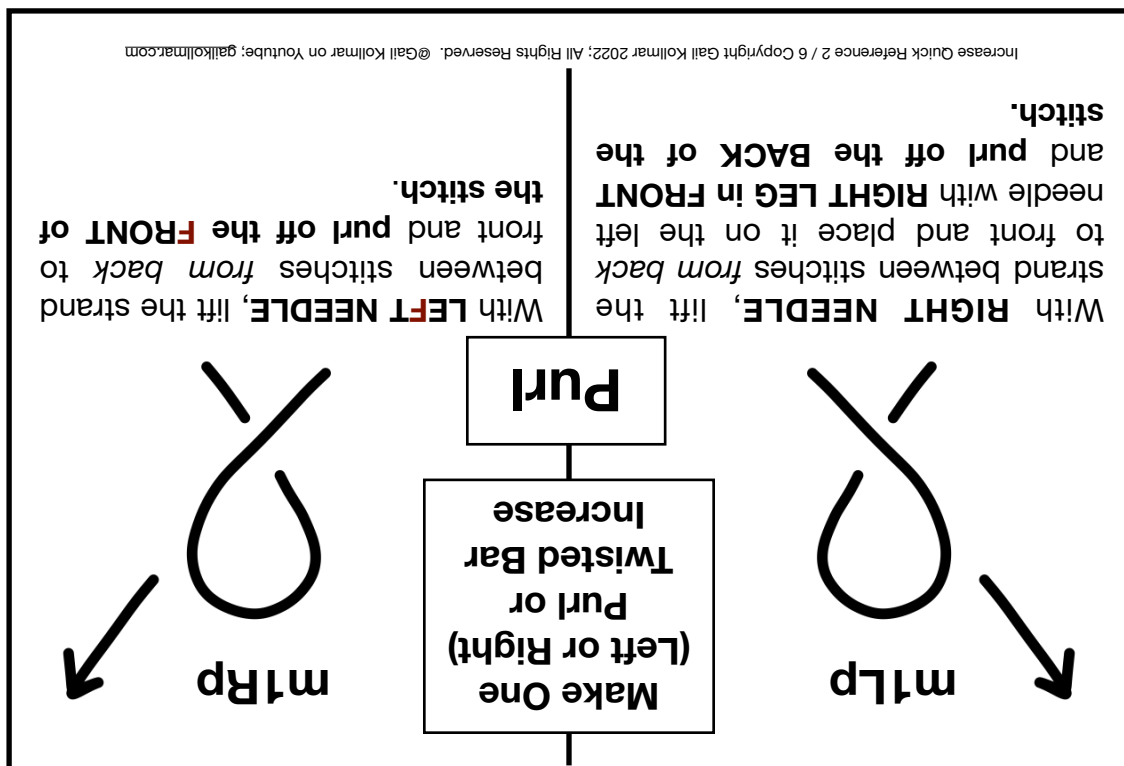


# The Knitting Workshop

## Increase Quick Reference





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

<p><b>m1 (L) k1</b></p> 	<p><b>Make one lifted</b></p>	<p><b>m1 (L) p1</b></p> 
<p>Make one lifted KNIT: <b>slide</b> right needle under the right leg of the stitch below the next stitch on the left needle as if to knit and <b>knit</b> it (M1), then <b>knit</b> the next stitch in the current row (k1).</p>		<p>Make one lifted PURL: <b>slide</b> the right needle under the right leg of the stitch below the next stitch on the left needle as if to purl and <b>purl</b> it (M1), then <b>purl</b> the next stitch in the current row (p1).</p>
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<p><b>m1 B (purl) or Pt/b</b></p> 	<p><b>Make one bar or Work front/back</b></p>	<p><b>m1 B (knit) or Kt/b</b></p> 
<p>On the wrong side of fabric, <b>purl</b> into the front of the next stitch, <b>purl</b> into the back of the same stitch, then <b>remove</b> the stitch from the left needle.</p> <p>Note: on the right side of fabric purl into the front of the stitch then knit into the back of the same stitch then remove the stitch from the left needle.</p>		<p><b>Knit</b> into the front of the next stitch, <b>knit</b> into the back of the same stitch, then <b>remove</b> the stitch from the left needle</p>
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<h3>M1 Open (knit)</h3>  <p>On a KNIT row, with left needle, <b>lift</b> the strand between stitches <i>from front to back</i> and <b>knit</b> under this strand. This will leave a small hole in the row below.</p>	<h3>M1 Open (purl)</h3>  <p>On a PURL row, with left needle, <b>lift</b> the strand between stitches <i>from front to back</i> and <b>purl</b> under this strand. This will leave a small hole in the row below.</p>
<p><b>M1 Open or Eyelet or Lifted Bar Increase</b></p>	

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<p>YO, yrn, O, wrn, or O</p>  <p>Yarn over, yarn round needle, wool round needle, O, or wool around needle: be sure your yarn is completely around your needle (360 degrees) before purling the next stitch. This will leave a small hole in your work in the current row. You will work a stitch into this hole on the next row.</p>	<p>YO, yrn, O, wron, or wryf</p>  <p>Yarn over, Yarn over needle, O, wool over (or on) needle: be sure your yarn is over your needle (<b>bring</b> yarn from back of needle, under the needle to front, and then over the needle to the back again) before knitting the next stitch. Why?: <b>move</b> the yarn between the needles to the front of your work and then take the yarn over the right needle to knit the next stitch. Both of these methods will leave a small hole in your work in the current row. You will work a stitch into this hole on the next row.</p>	
<p>Between Purls</p>	<p>Eyelet or Yarn Over or Over or Ornamental Increase :-) or a mistake :-)</p>	<p>Between Knits</p>



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## Single Decrease Quick Reference



<p><b>K2tog</b></p> 	<div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px; width: fit-content; margin: 0 auto;"> <p><b>Knit</b></p> </div>	 <p><b>SSK</b> and <b>SKP</b></p>
<p>Slide your right needle into the second stitch on the left needle as if to knit, then continue to slide the needle into the first stitch on the left needle as if to knit. <b>Knit them off together.</b></p>		<p><b>SSK:</b> <b>Slip</b> the first stitch as if to knit, <b>slip</b> the next stitch the same way, <b>slide</b> the left needle into the front of both slipped stitches on the right needle and <b>knit them off the back</b> of the stitch.</p> <p><b>SKP:</b> <b>Slip</b> the first stitch as if to knit, <b>knit</b> the next stitch, <b>pass</b> the second stitch on the right needle over the first stitch and off the needle.</p>
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<p><b>P2tog</b></p> 	<div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px; width: fit-content; margin: 0 auto;"> <p><b>Purl</b></p> </div>	 <p><b>SSPB</b></p>
<p>Slide your right needle into the first stitch on the left needle as if to purl, then continue to slide the needle into the second stitch on the left needle as if to purl. <b>Purl them off together.</b></p>		<p>With yarn in front, <b>slip</b> the first stitch as if to knit, <b>slip</b> the next stitch the same way, <b>slide both</b> stitches back to the left needle without twisting them, <b>purl them together off the back</b> of the stitch.</p>
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## Double Decrease Quick Reference



<p><b>K3tog</b></p> 	<p><b>Knit</b></p>	 <p><b>SSSK</b></p>
<p>Slide your right needle into the third stitch on the left needle as if to knit, then continue to slide the needle into the second and first stitches on the left needle as if to knit. <b>Knit all three off together.</b></p>		<p><b>Slip</b> the first stitch as if to knit, <b>slip</b> the next stitch the same way, <b>slip</b> the third stitch the same way, <b>slide</b> the left needle into the front of all three slipped stitches on the right needle and <b>knit them together off the back</b> of the stitch.</p>
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

<p><b>S11, k2tog, pss0</b></p> 	<p><b>Knit</b></p>	 <p><b>SSK, pns0</b></p>
<p><b>Slip</b> the first stitch as if to knit, <b>knit both</b> of the next two stitches together, <b>pass</b> the slipped stitch on the right needle over the knitted stitch and off the needle.</p>		<p><b>Slip</b> the first stitch as if to knit, <b>slip</b> the next stitch the same way, <b>slide</b> the left needle into the front of both slipped stitches on the right needle and <b>knit them together off the back</b> of the stitch. <b>Slip</b> the new knitted stitch to the left needle without twisting it, <b>pass</b> the second (next) stitch on the left needle over the knitted stitch and off the left needle. <b>Move</b> the knitted stitch back to the right needle without twisting it. <b>pns0</b> = pass next stitch over</p>
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<p><b>Sl2tog, sl1, k3tog tbl</b></p>  <p><b>Knit</b></p>	<p><b>Sl2tog, k1, p2sso</b></p> 
<p><b>Slip both</b> of the first two stitches together at the same time as if to knit, <b>slip</b> the next stitch as if to knit, <b>slide</b> the left needle into the front of all three slipped stitches on the right needle and <b>knit them together off the back</b> of the stitch. tbl= through back loop</p>	<p><b>Slip both</b> of the first two stitches together at the same time as if to knit, <b>knit</b> the next stitch, <b>pass both</b> of the two slipped stitches on the right needle over the knitted stitch and off the needle.</p>
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<p>Slide your right needle into the first stitch on the left needle as if to purl, then continue to slide the needle into the second and third stitches on the left needle as if to purl. <b>Purl all three off together.</b></p>	<p>With yarn in front, <b>slip</b> the first stitch as if to knit, <b>slip</b> the next third stitch the same way, <b>slip</b> all three slipped stitches back to the left needle while maintaining their orientation, <b>purl them together off the back</b> of the stitch.</p>		

# The Knitting Workshop

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<p><b>Sl1, SS, p2togB, pssso</b></p>  <p>With yarn in front, <b>slip</b> the first stitch as if to purl, <b>slip</b> the second stitch as if to knit, <b>slip</b> the third stitch as if to knit, <b>slip both</b> the second and third stitches back to the left needle maintaining orientation, <b>purl both</b> of the next two stitches on the left needle together at the same time <b>off the back</b> of the stitch, <b>pass</b> the slipped stitch on the right needle over the p2tog and off the needle. B= through the back of the stitch.</p>	<p><b>Purl</b></p>	<p><b>P2tog, pnsso</b></p>  <p>Slip the needle into the first stitch as if to purl and continue into the second stitch, <b>purl both</b> stitches together, <b>slip</b> this new purl stitch back to the left needle without twisting it, <b>pass</b> the second (next) stitch on the left needle over this purl and off the needle. <b>Slip</b> the purl stitch back to the right needle without twisting it. pnsso= pass next stitch over</p>
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<p><b>SS, S12togB, p1, p2sso</b></p>  <p>With yarn in front, <b>slip</b> the next stitch as if to knit, <b>slip</b> the next stitch the same way, <b>return both</b> slipped stitches back to the left needle maintaining orientation, <b>slip both</b> of these stitches together at the same time as if to purl off the back of the stitch, purl the next stitch, <b>pass both</b> slipped stitches on the right needle over the purred stitch and off the needle.</p>	<p><b>Purl</b></p>	<p><b>SS, S12togB, sl1, p3tog</b></p>  <p>With yarn in front, <b>slip</b> the next stitch as if to knit, <b>slip</b> the next stitch the same way, <b>return both</b> slipped stitches back to the left needle maintaining orientation, <b>slip both</b> of these stitches together at the same time as if to purl off the back of the stitch, <b>slip</b> the next stitch as if to purl, <b>slide</b> the point of the left needle into the back of all three slipped stitches on the right needle and <b>purl them off together</b>.</p>
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
